

Purpose of Request for Information (RFI)

- The RFI aims to collect public input to support several objectives
- For NTIA Middle Mile Grant Opportunity, broader state planning and investment

Key Objectives

- ✓ Develop a fact-set regarding middle-mile requirements (needs), existing assets, and remaining gaps.
- ✓ Develop a comprehensive strategy for the planning, design, funding, deployment, and operations of a statewide, open-access middle-mile network to address the gaps.
- ✓ Obtain expressions of interest from stakeholders seeking capacity from middle-mile program.
- Establish collaboration-driven approach for funding from federal and state grant programs and contribute matching capital.

Total Fund	\$100+ million
Maximize Project Size	• \$10 million
Matching Share	• 25%
Eligible Locations	Unserved: A household location that lacks access to a wireline-based broadband connection with a data rate of at least 25 Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload
	 Underserved: A household location that has access to a wireline-based broadband connection of at least 25 Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload but no greater than 100 Mbps download and 20 Mbps upload
Eligible Service Area	 Include those areas in which 80% of the household locations in the applicant's proposed funded service area are either unserved or underserved.
Eligible Projects	 A last-mile network that provides symmetrical 100/100 Mbps in the eligible service area through a terrestrial-based network. Note: Last-mile networks not meeting this symmetrical speed standard may be funded when impracticable to deploy due to geography, topography, or excessive cost barriers. The network must reliably offer at least 100/20Mbps and be eventually scalable to a minimum of 100 Mbps symmetrical. Network facilities that enable last-mile network(s) in the eligible service area, including middle-mile networks, colocation facilities, data centers, in-building networks, and community Wi-Fi deployments
Eligible Entities	 Local and tribal governments or any agency, subdivision, instrumentality, or political subdivision thereof; non-profit entities; for-profit corporations; limited liability corporations; cooperative or mutual organizations Collaborations among two or more of the eligible entities are eligible. One partner must be identified as the lead Applicant.
Eligible Expenditures	Expenditures for application preparation, network planning, infrastructure deployment, network equipment, long-term leases, personnel, environmental expenses

Title I - Broadband Equity, Access & Deployment Program

Formula-based grant program for U.S. states and territories. BEAD aims to close the access gap for unserved & underserved areas of the country.

Title III – Digital Equity Act

Three programs, established for planning & implementation of programs that promote digital equity, support digital inclusion activities, and build capacity related to the adoption of broadband.
