### **BEAD OVERVIEW**

New Mexico's statewide plans will unlock \$675 million in BEAD funds

## **Funding priorities for BEAD program**

- **1. Unserved locations**: those that only get internet service at 25/3 Mbps or less
- **2. Underserved locations**: those that get internet service between 25/3 & 100/20 Mbps
- **3. Community Anchor Institutions** (schools, libraries, hospitals, government) that cannot get 1/1 Gbps
- 4. Low-income & affordable housing

5-Year Action Plan in August

# Initial Proposal in December

Grant program data analytics, design, & rules, with public feedback

After final awards are submitted to NTIA & approved, will release remaining funds

Final Proposal in 2024/25

#### 13 Requirements of the Five-Year Action Plan

- Details of the existing broadband program or office
- 2. Funding available for broadband deployment and other broadband-related activities
- **3. Existing efforts** funded by the federal government or the state
- 4. Current and planned staffing
- 5. Obstacles or barriers to the successful implementation of the BEAD Program
- 6. Asset inventory that catalogues broadband adoption, affordability, equity, access, and deployment activities and partners
- 7. Description of the external **engagement process**
- 8. Availability and adoption data
- 9. Service needs and gaps
- 10. High-level plan for providing reliable, affordable, high-speed internet service, including
  - Estimated timeline and cost for universal service
  - · Planned utilization of federal, state, and local funding
  - Prioritization of areas for federal support
  - Public-private partnerships or cooperatives
  - · Strategies to address affordability issues, including ACP
  - Strategies to ensure an available and highly skilled workforce
- 11. Digital equity and inclusion needs, goals, and implementation strategies (satisfied by the completion of a State Digital Equity Plan)
- 12. Alignment with other economic development, telehealth, workforce development, related connectivity efforts
- 13. Technical assistance and additional capacity needed for successful implementation of the BEAD Program

#### 19 Requirements of the Initial Proposal

- 1. Long-term objectives
- 2. Steps to support, local, Tribal, and regional broadband planning processes or ongoing efforts
- 3. Existing funding from the federal and state governments
- 4. Coordination with Tribal, labor, and local organization
- 5. All unserved and underserved locations, based on the FCC map
- 6. Definition of "community anchor institution," map of CAIs, and determination of service
- 7. Proposed challenge process plan
- 8. Proposed grant program
- 9. Process to find Extremely High Cost Per Location Threshold to determine which locations are too costly to be served with fiber
- 10. If there might be excess funds, describe how they will be used
- 11. How labor requirements will be applied and enforced
- 12. How the workforce will be prepared
- 13. How minority, women-owned, and labor surplus area firms will be used
- **14.** Steps to reduce costs and barriers to deployment
- 15. Climate threats and proposed mitigation methods
- 16. Required **low-cost plan** for awardees
- 17. How 20 percent of funds will be used if provided early
- 18. Middle-class affordability plan
