Proclamation

WHEREAS, warmer, drier conditions, and overgrown forests increase the frequency and severity of wildfire impacts upon property, infrastructure, watersheds, and other natural resources; and

WHEREAS, large and destructive wildfires pose a significant threat to residents, visitors, and firefighters in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the financial and psychological costs of wildfire are borne both by citizens and the wildland firefighters who seek to quell these dangerous fire hazards; and

WHEREAS, New Mexicans in communities with high-fire hazard are at risk, and have a responsibility to reduce flammable material around their homes and communities before a fire occurs; and

WHEREAS, forest thinning and management, along with the safe and effective use of prescribed fire, are essential tools for reducing wildfire risk and creating resilient, fire-adapted landscapes; and

WHEREAS, local, state, federal, and tribal agencies in new Mexico are working together across boundaries and in partnership with communities to actively reduce the effects of natural and human-caused wildfires; and

WHEREAS, eighty percent of wildfires in New Mexico are human-caused and are therefore preventable.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Michelle Lujan Grisham, Governor of the State of New Mexico, do hereby proclaim March 30 - April 5, 2025, as:

"Wildfire Awareness Week"
