NMPRC to hold its next regular open meeting in Las Cruces

SANTA FE – While continuing to increase engagement with more communities across the state, the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission (NMPRC) will hold its next regular open meeting at the Doña Ana County Government Center in Las Cruces on Thursday, June 26. The meeting will also be streamed live on the NMPRC's YouTube channel.

There are several active cases with the Commission that could affect Las Cruces area customers' electric and gas services, including El Paso Electric's (EPE) application for approval of its Renewable Energy Act Plan for 2026 (case no. 25-00038-UT).

Additionally, there are two upcoming stakeholder engagement workshop sessions (July 1 and July 24) pertaining to EPE's upcoming Integrated Resource Plan. This plan is an essential tool for forecasting and meeting future energy demands. More information about the workshop can be found here.

The Commission encourages feedback and participation from area residents and stakeholders, as public input is essential to a fair, just, and reasonable decision-making process.
