Interim Final Rule (IFR) Addendum

Effective October 3, 2025

**Applies to: NMDOT DBE Program Plan** 

#### 1. Certification

- Firms must provide individualized documentation of social and economic disadvantage.
- References to the presumption of disadvantage are removed.
- NMDOT must verify IFR compliance before certifying or accepting interstate certifications.

#### 2. Denial of Certification (§26.86)

- Denial letters must state whether individualized disadvantage documentation was insufficient or missing.
- Firms denied during nationwide reevaluation may reapply once reevaluation is complete, even if 12 months haven't passed.
- Appeals must include IFR documentation.

## 3. Removal of Eligibility (§26.87)

- Grounds for removal now include failure to maintain IFR documentation.
- Complaints may allege noncompliance with IFR requirements.
- Hearings and written submissions must address IFR standards.

# **4. Suspension (§26.88)**

- Suspension applies if a firm fails to provide or update individualized disadvantage documentation.
- Reinstatement requires submission of IFR documentation.
- Suspension notices must reference IFR requirements.

## 5. Appeals (§26.89)

- Appeals must include individualized disadvantage documentation.
- DOT review explicitly checks whether IFR standards were applied.
- Constructive decertification applies if NMDOT fails to act on suspension tied to IFR documentation.

## 6. Effect of DOT Decisions (§26.91)

- DOT decisions remain binding only on the recipient appealed from.
- All recipients must apply DOT's determination regarding individualized disadvantage documentation consistently.
- Corrective actions must address IFR compliance.
- Other certifiers must apply IFR standards even if not required to certify the firm.

# 7. Compliance & Enforcement (§26.101–§26.105)

- Compliance reviews, complaints, conciliation agreements, and enforcement actions must explicitly evaluate IFR documentation.
- Enforcement findings must confirm whether IFR standards were applied.
- Failure to implement IFR requirements constitutes noncompliance.
