#### TRANSIT POLICIES

- No alcoholic beverages/open containers or smoking allowed on the trains, other transit vehicles, Rail Runner station areas or bus/shuttle stops.
- Do not leave children unattended.
- No hazardous materials allowed. Oxygen for personal use excepted.
- No pets allowed, with the exception of assistance animals.

#### **RAIL RUNNER POLICIES**

For your safety, stand behind the yellow warning strip on the edge of the platform as trains enter into, depart from and pass through the station.

 Passengers may bring a standard style, nonmotorized bicycle on board the train for free. Each train is able to accommodate up to 12 bicycles.

Each passenger car has space dedicated for bicycles (a total of four per car); additional space in the areas reserved for wheelchairs may be available. Naturally, priority is given to passengers in wheelchairs.

- Bicycle storage is available on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Do not ride your bicycle on the train or on the platforms.
- Secure bicycle parking is available at each of the train stations.
- The Rail Runner is not liable for damaged or stolen bicycles.

#### TRANSFER/FARE POLICIES

#### Santa Fe Trails & DOT South Capitol Shuttle

Free transfers for New Mexico Rail Runner Express and NM Park & Ride passengers to Santa Fe Trails and DOT South Capitol Shuttle with a valid NM Park & Ride Monthly Pass or New Mexico Rail Runner boarding/monthly pass, or a Santa Fe Trails monthly pass. Otherwise, \$1 fare one way.

#### The Santa Fe Pick-Up & NCRTD

Free at all times.

#### New Mexico Park & Ride

Unlimited trips on Park & Ride and New Mexico Rail Runner Express with Park & Ride Systemwide Monthly Pass (\$150).
